

PRE-HEALTH INFORMATION MANAGEMENT PLANNING GUIDE (KU CORE)

Admission Requirements: A minimum GPA of 2.5 is required to be considered for admission to the Health Information Management program at KUMC. A grade of C or better is required for all pre-requisites.

Application Deadline: The priority deadline is February 1 each year. If seats are still available, the program may accept applications after the deadline.

THINGS TO CONSIDER

- Students are required to complete 60 credit hours before starting the HIM program.
