



## PRE-PHYSICAL THERAPY PLANNING GUIDE (KU CORE)

**Pre-Physical Therapy** is a track of courses required for admission to KU's doctoral program in physical therapy. Students complete these requirements alongside the bachelor's degree of their choice. The GRE is no longer required but may be required for other schools. Other schools may have different admission requirements, so it's important to meet with a Pre-Health Academic Advisor early!

## THINGS TO CONSIDER

- These requirements are paired with any bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university. The degree must be completed by June 1, prior to entry into the summer entry PT program. The degree can be in any field; however, any coursework must include, either as part of the degree requirements or, in addition to the requirements, the above prerequisites.
- A combined human anatomy/physiology course that is at least 5 credit hours and includes a lab may be used to fulfill the anatomy & physiology requirements.
- Course Repeat is allowed; Credit/No Credit is not allowed for courses in the Pre-PT track.
- Applicants must possess a general understanding of health care and physical therapy based upon employment, observation, and/or volunteer experiences. A specific number of hours is not required, but one reference must be from a physical therapist.
