

For KU Lawrence students seeking admission to KUMC:

PRE-AUDIOLOGY PLANNING GUIDE

Pre-Audiology is a track made up of courses required for entry to KU's Clinical Doctor in Audiology program. Students complete these requirements alongside the bachelor's degree of their choice, though an undergraduate degree in Speech, Language, Hearing is highly recommended. If students select a different major, the following coursework must be completed, as well as 12 additional hours of basic sciences and math.

REQUIREMENTS

*Courses marked with an asterisk have pre-requisites not already listed below.

- Physics of Speech
 - Options at KU: SPLH 220*
 - Fulfills KU Core Goal 1.2
- Principles of Speech Science
 - Options at KU: SPLH 462
- Principles of Hearing Science
 - Options at KU: SPLH 463
- Language Development
 - Options at KU: SPLH 566
 - Fulfills KU Core Goal 3S
- Audiology Assessment and Rehabilitation
 - Options at KU: SPLH 568
 - Fulfills BGS Career Course Requirement
- Speech-Language Pathology
 - Options at KU: SPLH 571
 - Fulfills BGS Career Course Requirement

IMPORTANT NOTES

- These requirements are paired with any bachelor's degree from KU, though it is highly recommended students earn a degree in Speech-Language-Hearing. This major covers all course prerequisites; students with other majors are required to complete 12 additional math and science hours.
- Schedule an appointment with the University Career Center to prepare applications for audiology programs.
- If you plan to start the audiology program directly after senior year, it's recommended to apply by the end of the fall semester. Applications are typically due by January 15, but deadlines are subject to change.
- Admission typically requires:
 - A primary application, submitted through the Communication Science and Disorders Central Application system. A supplementary application from The University of Kansas.
 - Three references -- faculty are typically preferred, but employment or volunteer supervisors are also acceptable.
 - A complete resume including employment, academic history, leadership experience, and volunteer activities.

- Sample schedule:
 - 1st Spring: Physics of Speech
 - 2nd Fall: Principles of Speech Science
 - 2nd Spring: Principles of Hearing Science
 - 3rd Fall: Audiology Assessment and Rehabilitation
 - 3rd Spring: Language Development, Speech-Language Pathology
