

PRE-CLINICAL LAB SCIENCES PLANNING GUIDE (CORE 34)

Admission Requirements: A minimum GPA of 2.7 (cumulative and science/math specific) is required to be considered for admission to the Clinical Laboratory Sciences program in the School of Health Professions. You must have accrued 57 credit hours by the time you begin CLS studies.

Application Deadline: One class is admitted each year. To be considered, applications must be completed by December 15 of the year preceding the desired fall semester entry.

THINGS TO CONSIDER

- All science/math courses must be completed with a grade of C or better. C- is not acceptable for these courses.
- The Course Repeat Policy is allowed.
- Credit/No Credit is not allowed for science, math, English, or communications courses.
- Science and math prerequisite courses will only be accepted if they have been taken within the six years prior to submission of the application for admission to the CLS program.
- Virtual labs are not accepted. All labs must be completed on-campus.
- A combined anatomy and physiology course is only accepted if it is 8 hours and includes a lab.
